

STUDENT PROGRESS REPORTS TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS

The School Committees recognize the school's obligation to give regular reports of a student's progress. The School Committees further recognize that these reports are a vital form of communication between the schools and parents. The School Committees also believe that all progress reports must be based upon full information, accurately and honestly reported with the proper maintenance of confidentiality.

Verbal or written reports depicting the student's progress will be issued regularly following an evaluation by the appropriate teacher, teachers, or other professional personnel.

In addition to the regular reports, parents will be notified when a student's performance requires special attention.

Grading and promotion will be based on improvement, achievement, capability of the student, and the professional judgment of the teacher and Principal.

Major changes in the reporting system shall be preceded by a cooperative study and evaluation by teachers, principals, parents, and the Assistant Superintendent, who will share the proposal with the School Committees.
